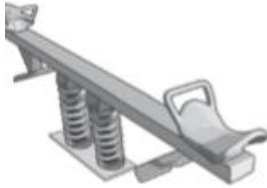

The Bermuda Triangle

Where Is the Bermuda Triangle?

The Bermuda Triangle is not a set place. It is an area of the Atlantic Ocean between 500,000 – 1,510,000 square miles in size. It can be found between the coasts of Florida, Puerto Rico and the island of Bermuda. It is a hot spot of activity and regularly sees a many ships and aircrafts travelling through it.



Why Is the Bermuda Triangle so Famous?

The area which became known as the Bermuda Triangle gained fame due to the many unusual tales of the strange activity happening there. The earliest known report of unexplained activity dates back to 1492. It was given by the Italian explorer and **navigator** Christopher Columbus and his crew.

What Did Christopher Columbus Report?

During their first **voyage** across the Atlantic Ocean, Columbus and his crew recorded many strange events in the **ship's log**. These all happened within the Bermuda Triangle.



The first of these was that the stars in the sky appeared to move around. The second was that Columbus saw a light moving up and down in the distance. When he asked his crew to come and look at the light, it vanished and reappeared multiple times.

The strangest thing that Columbus saw was a glowing, disc-shaped object. It came out of the water and shot upwards towards the sky.

Glossary

- **cargo**: Goods that are carried on a ship, aircraft or motor vehicle.
- **navigator**: A person who explores by sea and plans the route.
- **seaplane**: An aircraft with floats or skis instead of wheels. It can land on and take off from water.
- **ship's log**: An important record of the events that happen during a ship's journey.
- **voyage**: A long journey.

What Other Strange Things Are Said to Have Happened?

The Ellen Austin was a large **cargo** ship. The crew onboard found a small boat drifting along within the Bermuda Triangle. They decided that it had been abandoned. Captain Baker ordered four members of his crew to board the boat and sail it to New York. On the third day of sailing, the crew were said to disappear from the boat. When Captain Baker ordered a new crew to board the small boat, they disappeared too.

A US Navy ship called the USS Cyclops set off on a journey from Brazil to Baltimore, USA. The ship was almost 170 metres long and had a crew of 306 sailors aboard. On the ninth day of the ship's journey, it vanished and it was never seen or heard from again.

Twelve members of the US Navy left the Naval Air Station in Florida. They were taking part in a radar training flight aboard a **seaplane**. After sending their radio position at 1:16 a.m., the plane disappeared. Despite a ten-day search, neither the plane nor its crew were ever found.

Frank and Romina Leone left their home in Florida for a fishing trip aboard their new boat. After failing to return home, the US Coast Guard launched a rescue mission. They could not find Frank, Romina or any trace of their boat.
