Read for at least 10 minutes.

Reading Comprehension I have included a reading comprehension which can be read and one set of activities completed every day. Read it every day that you are completing a task to develop fluency with a familiar text.

<u>Keep a Diary</u> or encourage your child to <u>Free write</u> for approx. 15 minutes twice a week. It doesn't matter what they write as long as they are writing eg. Lists of favourite games, make up a poem or song etc.

<u>Tongue Twisters</u> - Here are 4 tongue twisters. Try a new one every day and make up your own on Friday. Say them as fast as you can, at least 5 times and challenge someone at home to beat you:

- 2. She sells seashells on the sea shore

- 4. Bubble, bobble, bubble, bobble, bobble...

Maths – Do these Daily

<u>Make sums with these answers</u> We had done this in class before closure. Get your child to make as many $+ -(x \div)$ sums as they can, but they have to have the answer for that day. On Monday all your sums have to have the answer 12. Eg. 4+8=12, 6+6=12, 18-6=1
