- Read a book for 15mins.
- Vocabulary development: We have looked at idioms and hyperbole over the past two weeks. This week we will be looking at a feature of vocabulary and writing called 'personification.' If you look at this word closely you will see the word 'person' within it **Personification.** This gives you a clue as to what personification is. **Personification** is giving human characteristics to nonhuman things. It is a figure of speech that can be used to make writing more interesting or to emphasise a point.

E.g. The trees **<u>danced</u>** in the wind.

The word *danced* describes the trees as if they were people. Unlike people, however, trees can't actually dance. Instead, the personification suggests that the trees are moving.

Below are some more examples of personification. Can you write them into your copy or on a sheet and underline the personification in each sentence? Email them to me and I will let you know what I think.

- The wind howled in the night.
- The car complained as the key was roughly turned in its ignition.
- Rita heard the last piece of pie calling her name.
- My alarm clock yells at me to get out of bed every morning.
- The avalanche devoured anything standing in its way.
- The door protested as it opened slowly.

- My house is a friend who protects me.
- The moon played hide and seek with the clouds.
- The approaching car's headlights winked at me.
- The camera loves her since she is so pretty.
- The stairs groaned as we walked on them.


